is a free, voluntary education program to evaluate watershed properties with a goal to protect water quality. Property owners will get suggested improvements to their site for ways to reduce erosion and stormwater runoff which can carry pollutants and phosphorous into the water.

Phosphorous

is found in fertilizer, pet waste, motor oil and household cleaners and soil. Too much phosphorous puts a lake out of balance and feeds **algal blooms.**
